#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Form 4: Financial Statement – Auditor's Report Candidate of the Kirk Walstedt Election Campaign (the "financial statement") for the campaign period May 2, 2022 to January 3, 2023 related to the Town of Lakeshore Municipal Election held on October 24, 2022, prepared in accordance with Section 88 of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statement present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the campaign as at January 3, 2023, and its results of operations for the campaign period then ended in accordance with the accounting treatment prescribed in the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

### Responsibilities of the Candidate for the Financial Statements

The Candidate is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statement in accordance with the Municipal Elections Act, and for such internal control as the Candidate determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statement that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Campaign's financial reporting process.

## Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statement

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.
